- 8. What level of cost breakdown and description of works did the Department require from applicants in Round 1?

How many funding agreements with applicants were varied to reduce the funding allocated to base station construction after the Department was alerted by the Financial Adviser in his or her Draft Working Paper that "at a number of base stations [the telecommunications company] included significant cost upgrades for their existing 'core network' " to add a new base station to their network?

Answer:

1. The ANAO provided the Department of Communications and the Arts with its initial Report Preparation Paper in relation to its audit of round 1 of the Mobile Black Spot Program on 22 February 2016.

The ANAO provided the Department with its proposed (draft) audit report on 13 April 2016.

2. The list of 499 mobile base stations funded under round 1 of the Mobile Black Spot Program can be found on the national map at www.nationalmap.gov.au.

The cost of an individual base station is commercial-in-confidence.

3. As at 9 November 2016, co-location is expected to occur at up to 68 round 1 base stations.

- 4. Please refer to the relevant candidate's website for election commitments made regarding round 3 of the Mobile Black Spot Program.
- 5. The program guidelines for both rounds 1 and 2 of the Mobile Black Spot Program encourage the use of National Broadband Network (NBN) infrastructure to deliver improved mobile coverage to locations on the Government's database of reported regional mobile black spots. Discussions regarding the use of NBN infrastructure has occurred directly between the carriers and NBN Co Limited.
- 6. As at 9 November 2016, 46 round 1 base stations are expected to be co-located on NBN fixed wireless towers.
- 7. The Department of Communications and the Arts is currently considering the applications received for funding under round 2 of the Mobile Black Spot Program.
- 8. The costing requirements did not change between rounds 1 and 2 of the Mobile Black Spot Program.

For both rounds, the Department required applicants to supply information about the estimated cost of construction and installation, the estimated cost of deployment of backhaul and the estimated cost of site acquisition and preparation (including provisioning of power) for each proposed base station. For each proposed base station, applicants were also required to advise how much they would be contributing as well as how much third party funding (if any) had been offered and how much Commonwealth funding was sought.

For both rounds, applicants were required to provide details about the type of backhaul that would be deployed at each proposed base station, the structure and antenna height, whether the base station was a greenfield or brownfield. Under round 2, applicants were also required for each proposed base station to indicate whether it would be provisioned with auxiliary power to support operation for eight hours or longer.

9. Many of the round 1 base stations are in very remote areas where exchanges were only ever designed to provide standard telephone services. The cost of building the base station is only one element of the program, if the data can't be efficiently and effectively transferred back to the network then the quality of service is compromised.

Reflecting this, carriers' applications necessarily included reasonable costs for connecting base stations to the nearest point of interconnection, where the required supporting infrastructure did not exist for proposed locations.

The funding agreements includes 'claw-back' provisions to ensure the program only pays actual costs for the rollout.

10. The Department of Communications and the Arts did not assist with promoting, organising or provide any funding towards any of the regional communications forums.

Upon request, the Department provided background briefing to the Parliamentary Secretary.

- 11. Round 2 is currently being assessed and round 3 has not yet commenced.
