Senator LUDWIG asked:

- 830. How many staff reductions/voluntary redundancies have occurred from Supplementary Budget Estimates in November 2013 to date?
 - a. What was the reason for these reductions?
 - b. Were any of these reductions involuntary redundancies? If yes, provide details.
- 831. Are there any plans for further staff reductions/voluntary redundancies? If so, please advise details including if there is a reduction target, how this will be achieved, and if any services/programs will be cut.
 - a. If there are plans for staff reductions, please give the reason why these are happening.
- 832. Are there any plans for involuntary redundancies? If yes, provide details.
- 833. How many ongoing staff left the department/agency from Supplementary Budget Estimates in November 2013 to date? What classification were these staff?
- 834. How many non-ongoing staff left department/agency from Supplementary Budget Estimates in November 2013 to date? What classification were these staff?

Answer:

- 830. Five voluntary redundancies have occurred from 25 November 2013 to 5 March 2014.
 - (a) The reason for these redundancies was because of technological or other changes in the work methods of the ABS.
 - (b) No.
- 831. In March 2014, the ABS commenced a voluntary redundancy program. It is anticipated that approximately 70 to 100 employees will formally be declared excess to requirements as a result of the program. Changes to the forward work program are being considered to align the work program with the expected budget for 2014/15.
 - (a) To enable the ABS to meet its budget in 2014/15
- 832. There are currently no plans for involuntary redundancies.
- 833. Between 26 November 2013 and 5 March 2014, 60 ongoing staff (excluding ABS Interviewers) left the ABS. Of these; 46 were at the APS level, 13 were at the Executive Level (EL1s and EL2s) and one at the SES level (SESB1). In addition, the Australian Statistician departed the ABS.
- 834. Between 26 November 2013 and 5 March 2014, 43 non-ongoing staff (excluding ABS Interviewers) left the ABS. Of these; 42 were at the APS level and one was at the Executive Level (an EL1).
