With regard to announcement that the Government is currently developing a new International Trade Remedies Advisory Service, which will commence in early 2015:

- 1. Can you provide an update- has the program commenced?
- 2. Was there any gap in terms of the commencement of this program and the ceasing of the program which was being delivered to the AiG?
- 3. Will the service be delivered by Department of Industry or the Anti-dumping Commission?
- 4. What is the funding for the service in comparison to the previous funding provided to the AiG for this service?
- 5. Has the former International Trade Remedies Advisor who was seconded with the AiG being retained through this process? If not, why not?

## **ANSWER**

- 1. The International Trade Remedies Advisory (ITRA) Service has commenced delivering assistance to small and medium sized businesses.

- 3. The ITRA Service is being delivered by the AusIndustry Business Services Division of the Department of Industry and Science. It is not being administered by the Anti-Dumping Commission.
