- 1. What is the annual cost for Australia as a party to the agreement for the Centre for Agriculture and Biosciences International (CABI)?
- 2. Has there been an assessment of the benefits that Australia receives from its membership of CABI? If yes, what was the result of that assessment?
- 3. Can you confirm if there are plans to withdraw from membership of CABI? If yes, what is the justification for withdrawal?

ANSWER

- o CSIRO is currently responsible for Australia's CABI membership costs.
- CSIRO has not received the invoice for the current year, CABI has advised that this will be in the order of A\$295,000. The previous invoice paid in June 2014 was \$86,250GBP (approximately A\$160,000).
- 2 No assessment has been conducted.
- CSIRO is exploring the possibility of transferring the treaty obligations to a more appropriate Commonwealth entity. Due to changes in CABI's operational model since the late 1990s there there is a strategic misalignment between CABI's operations and CSIRO's own activities. Most of CABI's pursuits are in the Overseas Development Assistance Sector.
