- 1. Yes, the Australia Day Achievement Awards.
- 2. The key objectives of the department's Australia Day Achievement Awards are to:
 - recognise Australian Public Servants who have made a noteworthy contribution to their department over the past year or given outstanding service over a number of years.
 - recognise and value employees of the department who have made a significant contribution, beyond the requirement of their position, to the work or profile of the department.
 - recognise a specific instance of collaboration that promotes the benefit of building on shared knowledge and experience.
 - contribute to a more satisfying work environment, which takes pride in the achievements of staff.
- 3. The awards recognise outstanding individual or team achievement and/or contribution in one or more of the following categories:
 - achievement or major contribution of the highest standard to the work of the department.
 - noteworthy innovation in program, project or policy development.
 - exemplary collaboration by an individual and/or a team in achieving a high quality outcome for the department.
 - consistently high service excellence to the department's external or internal clients.

- 4. The award consists of an engraved medallion and certificate, presented by the Secretary at the Australia Day awards ceremony in January.
- 5. \$3000 for all awards (including certificates, medallions and engraving) (\$65 per award for 46 awards).
- 6. The medallions and certificate are presented at the Australia Day Awards ceremony by the Secretary.
- 7. The awards were presented by the department's Secretary, Glenys Beauchamp.
- 8/9 A ceremony was held at the National Convention Centre followed by a all staff morning tea in the foyer. At lunchtime the Executive hosted a lunch for the recipients in the department's amenities room.
