Since the change of Prime Minister on 14 September, 2015:

1000. Please detail changes to structures, officials, offices, units, taskforce or other processes has the department dedicated to meeting the government's red tape reduction targets?

- 1001. How many officers have been placed in those units and at what level?
- 1002. How have they been recruited?

- 1000. There has been no substantive changes to structures, officials, offices, units, taskforce or other processes.
 - a) Because the ACCC administers legislation that sits within various portfolios, we continue to work with departments such as the Treasury and the Department of Communications to progress reforms and ensure the savings generated are recorded and aggregated by the relevant department.

- 1004. As set out in the answer to 2014-15 SBT 818, the ACCC/AER has not created a dedicated unit or taskforce to meet the government's red tape reduction targets. Overall responsibility for the ACCC's red tape reduction activities lies with the ACCC's SES Band 3 Chief Operating Officer. One EL2 and one EL1 level staff are the project officers primarily responsible although this is not their sole responsibility. Numerous staff from across all areas of the ACCC/AER have been involved in identifying and progressing opportunities to reduce red tape and calculating the change in red tape due to regulations being removed/amended/added.
