3670. Has the Department undertaken any modelling of behavioural changes been modelled as part of working out the costing and impacts of the Government's child care package?

3671. On 23 October 2015, the Prime Minister said in a media release that "Our Jobs for Families package will encourage an estimated 240,000 families to increase their involvement

in paid work, including almost 38,000 jobless families." (release available at http://www.malcolmturnbull.com.au/issues/apply-now-for-the-nanny-pilot-programme)

- a) Was Treasury involved in calculating these figures?
- b) Has other workforce participation or government tax revenue calculations been conducted in relation to the child care package? Please provide.
- c) Has there been any assessment of how many families might be discouraged from returning to the workforce because the child care changes will make them worse off?
- 3672. If the definition of 'volunteering' under the activity test were to be altered so that a larger or smaller number of children and families might have access to subsidised child care, would this require the costing of the reforms to be altered?
- 3673. If the definition of volunteering needed to gain access to child care was very 'light touch' would the package cost more than it does now?
- 3674. Has Treasury costed any alternative definitions of volunteering?
- 3675. What were those alternatives?

Answer:
