## **QUESTION No.:** AI-69

1. Media reports in recently have questioned the claim that CSG is any cleaner than coal once you include the leakage from wells, pipes and other equipment. Tim Forcey from the Melbourne Energy Institute at the University of Melbourne has been using a Forward Looking Infra-Red (FLIR) video recorder to observe methane leaking out of CSG wells. Wells near Chinchilla in Qld look more like smokestacks venting methane into the atmosphere – have you seen that footage?

2. Can you provide an update on the DoE-funded CSIRO research fugitive emissions from CSG which is supposed to help us assess to true climate impact of CSG?

- 4. Can you confirm the scope of Phase 2 for us? I.e.
  - a. Whether it is looking at shale / tight gas fracking
  - b. Whether it is looking at water treatment infrastructure
  - c. Whether it is looking at decommissioned / old wells
- 5. Can you confirm the sample size of Phase 2?
- 6. When is this phase 2 report scheduled to be complete?
- 7. When published?
- 8. Is it with the Minister now?

9. Minister Josh Frydenberg is very keen to roll out fracking for unconventional gas across the country, including in NT, Vic and NSW where there are restrictions – have you ever briefed him on the potential hidden climate impacts of this leaking methane?

10. When did those briefings take place? Who was present?
