- 660. Has the Department/agency received any updated advice on how to respond to FOI requests?
- 661. What is the total cost to the department to process FOI requests for this financial year to date?
- 662. How many FOI requests has the Department received for this financial year to date?
  - a) How many requests have been denied and how many have been granted?
  - b) Has the department failed to meet the processing times outlined in the FOI Act for any requests? If so, how many and why?
  - c) Do any of these requests remain outstanding? If so, how many and why?
- 663. How many conclusive certificates have been issued in relation to FOI requests for this financial year to date?

# Answer:

- 660. The ACCC has received advice on how to respond to FOI requests from the Australian Government Solicitor and the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner.
- 661. In the 2011-2012 financial year (1 July 2011 to 30 June 2012), the total cost to the ACCC to process FOI requests was approximately \$359 591.55. This amount is calculated as follows:
