Please note that a letter clarifying Ms Pascoe's response in relation to the Executive Adviser position in the ACNC was sent to Senator Bishop on 7 June as below:

Under a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) arrangement with the ATO, the ACNC is bound by the ATO job profiling system. An EL1 Executive Advisor is considered part of the "Administration" job family.

As such the Senior Executive Assistant for the ACNC Commissioner has the official title of Executive Advisor. This leadership role involves the coordination of the two other administrative staff, and requires the performance of detailed, complex and sensitive operational and administrative work, an extensive understanding of the portfolio responsibilities of the ACNC Commissioner as well as engaging and delivering complex problem solving and issues management.
