Answer:

504. Coffee machines have been purchased for staff usage and the operating cost to ASIC is estimated at \$4.51 per person per month. Costs, including the initial purchase, are detailed by site in the table below:

a. Coffee machines were purchased to encourage staff interaction across business units within the office environment. Coffee machines are generally located in the central

breakout space to promote this interaction. This approach has been employed by a number of other Commonwealth Agencies and is common in the private sector.

- Anecdotal evidence suggests that leaving the premises to purchase coffee from a cafe or coffee cart adds 15 minutes to a coffee break.
 - In addition, ASIC staff use the opportunity to hold informal meetings while collecting their coffee and the integrity of information can be better managed when these meetings are held within the secure perimeter of the ASIC Tenancy.
 - I. Whilst this is not monitored, usage of the coffee machines would suggest that staff are leaving the office premises less during business hours for this purpose.
- c. Coffee machines are assets and as such were funded from ASIC's capital budget.
- d. All ASIC staff have access to the coffee machines.
- e. General maintenance of the machines, including re-stocking and cleaning is managed by the local ASIC Property and Business Services team. Breakdown maintenance for machines is provided by the supplier of the machines. In larger offices, daily cleaning is absorbed within the Tenancy cleaning contract.
 - II. This financial year to date (31 May 2013), ASIC has spent \$20,102.91 on maintenance (ex GST).
 - III. All maintenance costs are funded from ASIC's operating budget.
- f. Ongoing costs are \$169,611.71 (ex GST) per annum. However from 15 April 2013, ASIC instituted a charge of \$1 per cup for coffee from the Espresso Machines. This charge was calculated to cover all ongoing consumable costs and maintenance.
- 505. ASIC does not rent any coffee machines for staff usage.
