#### **Senator BUSHBY asked:**

- 516. Could the department/agency provide an update list of all grants, including ad hoc and one-off grants for this financial year to date? Please provide details of the recipients, the amount, the intended use of the grants and what locations have benefited from the grants.
- 517. Have all grant agreement details been published on its website within the required timeframe? If not, provide details

#### **Answer:**

516. For the financial year to 31 May 2013, discretionary grants of approximately \$2.598m have been approved by ASIC. These grants were paid from ASIC's Assetless Administration Fund (AA Fund) which is used to finance preliminary investigations and reports by liquidators into the failure of companies with few or no assets. A breakdown by location is shown below:
