- 1. In relation to the CSIRO restructure Innovation Organisation Reform announced in April 2014 please answer the following:
  - a. What is the effect on staffing levels of the restructure?
  - b. Please outline the sites impacted by the restructure and the number of positions per site impacted.
  - c. Please outline the states impacted by the restructure and the number of positions per state impacted.
  - d. Please outline the staffing profiles of each division and flagship both pre and post restructure.
- 2. In relation to impacts of budget cuts to CSIRO's appropriation announced in May 2014, and the annual directions statement please answer the following:
  - a. What is the effect on staffing levels?
  - b. Please outline the sites impacted and the number of positions per site impacted.
  - c. Please outline the states impacted and the number of positions per state impacted.
  - d. Please outline the staffing profiles of each division and flagship.

## **ANSWER**

1.

- a. As result of organisational reform programs announced in April 2104 staffing levels are expected to be reduced by 272 FTE.
- b. Information about sites impacted by the reform program remains subject to further consultative processes and was not finalised at the time of preparing the response.
- c. Information about states impacted by the reform program remains subject to further consultative processes and was not finalised at the time of preparing the response.
- d. Refer **Table 1** below for the staffing profile of Divisions impacted by the reform program.

2.

- a. As result of budget cuts to CSIRO's appropriation announced in May 2014 and reductions in external co-investment and consulting revenue, staffing levels are expected to be reduced by 422 FTE.
- b. Information about sites impacted by the budget cuts remains subject to further consultative processes and was not finalised at the time of preparing the response.
- c. Information about states impacted by the budget cuts remains subject to further consultative processes and was not finalised at the time of preparing the response.
