1737. Please detail how much electrical equipment, phones and computers the department/agency has in storage or unallocated to staff.
1738. Please detail the purchase, storage and ongoing costs associated with equipment, phones and computers in storage or unallocated.

**Answer:**

1737. The Australian Prudential Regulation Authority (APRA) has the following equipment in storage:
- two Blackberry handsets used as replacement devices for staff;
  - 10 standard laptops;
  - 10 standard desktops;
  - 33 RSA tokens; and
  - 110 Encrypted USB drives.
1738. The initial purchase price of equipment referred to above is:
- each blackberry handset - \$270;
  - each standard laptop - approximately \$1,000;
  - each standard desktop - approximately \$700;
  - each RSA token - approximately \$55; and
  - each USB drive - approximately \$50.

All the equipment referred to above is securely stored onsite so there are no costs associated with storage. In relation to Blackberries and laptops and desktops, there were no costs associated with the devices as they were not active. Warranties remain current as part of the initial purchase price.
