- 2577. The Agency has national responsibility and operates out of a single office location. In conducting reviews, fieldwork involves meeting with taxpayers and Australian Taxation Office (ATO) staff throughout Australia. Total flight expenditure for the period between 1<sup>st</sup> March 2014 to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2014 is \$11,618. The agency's travel is arranged by the Department of Treasury under a service level agreement. The Treasury advised that its reporting system is unable to break down classes of travel. For the period between 1<sup>st</sup> March 2014 to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2014, total travel allowance expenditure is \$2,223. Whole-of Australian Government (WoAG) and Travel Management charges for the period between 1<sup>st</sup> March 2014 to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2014 \$255.
