Answer:

- 416. Disputes between departmental and/or agency staff at the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority are mediated either through human resources and/or line manager involvement or through an external third party.
- 417. Outside firms are used occasionally to mediate disputes. The firm used during 2014/15, was Carmel MacPherson and Associates Pty Ltd.

 - b) \$11,797.50.
 - c) and d) The contract commenced on 1 March 2015 and expired on 31 March 2015.
 - e) The firm has specialist workplace investigators.
 - f) Investigation into a workplace complaint.
