## ANSWER

These answers were prepared by the Department of Agriculture and Water Resources which has responsibility for this area of work.

a. Who did the expert panel include?

b. What was the advice given by the technical expert panel?

The panel provided advice to the department on the technical merit of the 60 Expressions of Interest (EOI) submitted by state and territory governments for funding under the feasibility component of the National Water Infrastructure Development Fund.

The EOI submitted were assessed against the assessment criteria set out in the fund – feasibility study expression of interest guidelines.

Advice to the department is commercial-in-confidence and forms part of the government's policy deliberations.

c. Can the advice of the technical panel be produced?

No - advice to the department is commercial-in-confidence and forms part of the government's policy deliberations.

d. Did the panel recommend any hydro power component?

The role of the panel was to assess the merit of the EOI submitted by the state and territory governments against the assessment criteria set out in the guidelines for feasibility funding. As such the panel's recommendation covered the suitability of an EOI in its entirety rather than any single component of a study.

e. Did the panel recommend any gravity fed pump component?
