Senator BUSHBY asked:

86. CHAIR: ... Does the ABS use employees or contractors for its data collection and survey activities or a mixture of both?

Mr I Ewing: Primarily the ABS uses its employees for data collection. We do not engage contractors to collect data.

CHAIR: Would you mind taking on notice, for the employees, how many staff and what classification those staff are at. Are you employed in data collection and survey activities?

Mr I Ewing: Yes.

CHAIR: Also, if you could provide an indication of the cost of any contractors that are used for the same purposes.

Mr I Ewing: Yes.

Answer:

- 86. As at 30 November 2013 the ABS employed 2,809 operative staff employed under the *Public Service Act 1999* (PSA), consisting of:
 - 2,127 APS level staff
 - 640 EL staff
 - 42 SES staff

The majority of ABS staff are directly involved in statistical business (e.g. design, development, collection, processing, editing, analysing, quality assurance, dissemination).

The number of ABS APS staff whose <u>primary</u> role was the direct collection and capture of administrative or survey data was 144, and they were all at the APS1-5 levels.

Additionally, as at 30 November 2013 the ABS employed 482 Interviewers who undertook data collection for household surveys. These staff are employed under Subsection 16(2) of the *Australian Bureau of Statistics Act 1975* in accordance with Regulation 3 of the *Statistics Regulations*, and as such are not employed under the PSA.

The ABS does not employ contractors for data collection and survey activities.
