- 6. Martin Hoffman, Deputy Secretary from the Department of Industry and co-chair of the Energy Sustainability Working Group attended the G20 Leaders' Summit in Brisbane.
- 7. Return airfares to the G20 conference in Brisbane from Canberra cost a total of \$1543.
- 8. Accommodation costs were covered by Prime Minister and Cabinet.
- 9. Other associated expenses including meals and transport costs were \$388
- 10. Three G20 Energy Sustainability Working Group banners were purchased at a cost of \$1,570 as well as 20 G20 Pins, 7 scarves and 5 ties at a cost of \$675. Pins, scarves and ties were for Secretariat staff to wear so delegates could identify them at meetings. Merchandise was purchased at the start of 2014 for use at all 3 meetings.

11. The Department, fulfilling its role as the secretariat for the ESWG, prepared the G20 ESWG 2014 co-chairs report. The report summarises the activities of the ESWG throughout 2014.
