1139. One of the Commission's functions, specified in the *Productivity Commission Act 1998*, is to undertake research on issues relating to industry, industry development and productivity. This research supports and complements the Commission's core functions of conducting public inquiries and studies commissioned by the Government. This research is overseen by the Commission's research committee.

1140. a) The Commission has recently commenced three new major research projects, on: Housing Decisions of Older Australians (expected completion November 2015); Developments in Anti-Dumping Arrangements (expected completion early 2016); and Indigenous Primary School Education Outcomes: Key Contributors (expected completion May 2016).
