- 1. How much funding was cut from Geoscience Australia in the 2014-15 Budget?
- 2. What effect has this had on the delivery of Geoscience Australia's programs?
- 3. What has that reduction meant to the workload of the agency?
- 4. How much will Geoscience Australia receive under the Exploring for the Future program?
- 5. Is that \$100 million over four years from 2016-17?
- 6. Please provide a breakdown of much Geoscience Australia will receive each year over the forward estimates?
- 7. What can this allocated funding be used for?
- 8. The \$100 million allocated to the Exploring for the Future program over the next four years doesn't make up for the 2014 budget cut, does it?

ANSWER

- 1. The total reduction in funding for Geoscience Australia in the 2014-15 Budget was \$11.305 million over four years, reflecting whole of government savings measures.
- 2. The reduction has had some impact on the number of Commonwealth funded Geoscience Australia programs.
- 3. The reduction has had some impact on capacity in the agency.
- 4. \$100.5 million over 4 years (refer to page 149 of the 2016-17 Industry, Innovation and Science Portfolio Budget Statements).
- 5. Yes (refer to page 149 of the 2016-17 Industry, Innovation and Science Portfolio Budget Statements).
- 6. The breakdown is provided on page 149 of the 2016-17 Industry, Innovation and Science Portfolio Budget Statements.
- 7. The Australian Government is providing \$100 million over four years for the *Exploring for the Future* programme which can be used to fund data acquisition suppliers and a range of contract staff. It will be used to produce:

- new precompetitive geoscience information that will boost exploration investment by assisting industry to better target areas likely to contain the next major oil, gas and mineral deposits;
- a thorough assessment of groundwater resources; and
- an analysis of the salinity risk for potential agricultural areas.
- 8. The funding provided for the *Exploring for the Future* budget measure significantly exceeds the reduction in funding in the 2014-15 Budget as a result of whole of government savings measures.
