CSP funding

Question

"In the Explanatory Memorandum to the current Bill, the Government says that the ten-year impact of the changes included in the Bill will be \$5.84 billion in savings to the Budget. Can you unpack that figure for us? How much of the \$5.8 billion is represented by the planned 20% cut to the CGS?

What will be the cost of the extension of CSP funding to NUHEPS over ten years? What will be the cost of extending CSP funding to sub-bachelor courses? What will be the cost to the Budget of the new provision "pausing" HELP repayments for five years for the main care-giver to a new baby?

Answer

The expected financial impacts of the Government's higher education reforms for the periods 2014-15 to 2017-18 and 2014-15 to 2023-24 are outlined in the table below.
