NAPLAN testing

Question

Senator WRIGHT: So approximately 1,000 students. That was correct for years 3 and 9—around that figure? Percentages do not necessarily mean much. I am just trying to imagine how many students that is.

Dr Rabinowitz: I will get you those numbers.

Answer

The Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority has provided the following response.

For the 2014 National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN), there was a slight increase in the percentage of withdrawn students nationally from previous years.

The withdrawal rates across Australia for NAPLAN reading tests are provided below. (Withdrawal rates are similar across content areas.)
