TEQSA: Processing time for reaccreditation

Question

Senator KIM CARR: I note that you are indicating that processing times for registrations, accreditations and so on will increase over the next two years. That is due to budgetary pressures. I am citing here page 22 of your annual report. You have met your statutory requirements—I take it you are not suggesting otherwise—in your own internal targets in three areas, but you have failed, in the last year, to meet your target for the processing of course accreditations. That is again from the annual report at page 21. I am just making sure I have got this right. You say that the average processing time for reaccreditation in the last year is now 263 days. Can you provide details on the span of time that it is taking. What is the longest? An average figure gives you somewhere, presumably, in the middle. So what is the longest time now that it takes to get a registration, and what is the shortest time? Mr McClaran: I think we would have to take that question on notice and come back to you with the figures.

Answer

The timeframes (in calendar days) for processing applications for initial registration, reregistration, course accreditation and course re-accreditation during the 2015-16 financial year to date are set out in the table below.
