Answer

e. The nature of the review	To ensure the operation of the Hotline and the Australian Government's management of complaints is informed by good practice models, and to ensure that value for money is achieved.

Their terms of reference	 To ensure the Hotline is operating as efficiently and effectively as possible in assisting consumers to report training complaints to the most appropriate agency, authority or jurisdiction. To assess the contribution of the Hotline in helping authorities to deal with poor quality providers and organisations, and opportunities to improve its contribution. To undertake initial identification of any gaps in management of complaints by the Australian Government, and potential options to address these gaps that would benefit from further consideration. This includes consideration of whether more systemic approaches to support resolution of individual student complaints are required. To undertake identification of any gaps in data collection via the Hotline that would assist in better identifying consumer needs and therefore assist in improving the Australian Government's management of training complaints. Consider any further actions/responses the Hotline could utilise to respond to caller issues.
g. The scope of the review	The main focus of the review is on management of training (VET) related complaints by the Hotline as outlined above. However, the review also provides an opportunity to consider more broadly whether there are any gaps in the management of training complaints by the Commonwealth.
