## POA - Legal advice

#### Question

Senator BERNARDI: The minister has to approve that, don't you, minister? In relation to those guidelines, was there ever any legal advice that the department received or any other advice about whether they complied with state antidiscrimination laws, et cetera, or even Commonwealth antidiscrimination laws?

Dr Bruniges: Not that I am aware of. I would need to take that on notice.

Ms Wilson: That was quite a long time ago.

#### **Answer**

The Priority of Access Guidelines have been part of the legislative framework for child care since 2000.

There is no record of the Department of Education and Training having received legal advice about the issue.
