## Students with disability

## Question

What is being done to assure the technical quality, uniformity and timeliness of the data?

#### Answer

The Joint Working Group to Provide Advice on Reform for Students with Disability oversees a range of activities at national, jurisdictional and school levels to improve the quality and consistency of the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). These include:

- National: provision of a professional learning website with resources and guidance to support schools with the data collection process; communications materials for parents/carers and the broader public; annual NCCD guidelines; and independent and internal reviews of collection processes and quality
- Jurisdictional: professional learning opportunities on the NCCD, *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and Disability Standards for Education 2005; dedicated staff to support schools with the data collection process; information and moderation sessions; and the provision of data collection tools
- School: internal reviews of data quality; information sessions; and ongoing refinements to school processes in undertaking the data collection.

At its 16 December 2016 meeting, Education Council agreed in principle that the NCCD should be one of a range of factors to inform policy and funding decisions for students with disability and to continue to work collaboratively to improve data quality and consistency.
