Attracting and retaining experienced school leaders in disadvantaged schools

Question

The *Quality Schools, Quality Outcomes* (QSQO) document also stated that “states and territories should establish incentives to attract and retain experienced school leaders in disadvantaged schools.” (p.10).

- How will this be implemented?
- Have states and territories agreed to implement this?
- What is the timeline for implementation?

Answer

In May 2016, the Australian Government’s *Quality Schools, Quality Outcomes* policy document for school reform outlined a number of key areas for future focus. It was clearly outlined in the policy document that “consultation with states and territories, the non-government school sector, teachers, school leaders and the community will be central to the development of future schooling directions.”

The Minister for Education and Training is undertaking this consultation through a range of mechanisms, including Education Council.
