Current arrangements produce inequitable results for 'like' students and schools between jurisdictions

Question

The Department referred to how current arrangements produce inequitable results for 'like' students and schools between jurisdictions - can the Department provide these examples, and any others?

Answer

Examples are available in SQ17-000510. An additional example using different assumptions with a similar Schooling Resource Standard of the hypothetical school is provided below. This applies the state/territory average Commonwealth contribution for each sector.

Note: the nominal per student funding entitlement may differ to what a state, territory or non-government system would distribute to a school.
