Job Services Australia 1. In respect of the Labour Market Assistance Outcomes publication for June 2012, please provide details of the 'in scope populations' for each table, if possible adjusted to prevent double counting of exits, and the reasons for the omission of these data from the publication (they were included in previous years of the same publication) 2. Please provide data on the number of entries of very long term unemployed people into the 11-month work experience scheme announced in the Building Australia's Future Workforce statement during 2012. Please indicate the proportion of program participants in each year that were employed three months after exiting the scheme (measured in the same way as in the Labour Market Assistance Outcomes publication).

Answer

1. In respect of the Labour Market Assistance Outcomes publication for June 2012, please provide details of the 'in scope populations' for each table, if possible adjusted to prevent double counting of exits, and the reasons for the omission of these data from the publication (they were included in previous years of the same publication)

The in-scope populations are designed to ensure that the reported outcomes are representative of program performance and are defined in the 'Sampling, In-scope populations and Results' section on page 34 of the *Labour Market Assistance Outcomes, June 2012* report. In-scope population counts were no longer published after the year ending December 2011 report due to continued misinterpretation of these figures as net counts of job seekers exiting assistance, but are available on request.

For Job Services Australia, the in-scope populations are defined in the following ways:

Stream Service outcomes - Tables 1.1, 1.6, 1.8, 2.1 to 2.11 count job seekers as in-scope if, during the reference period, they exited from JSA assistance, or a phase of assistance (e.g. initial 12 month service period, work experience phase), or they received assistance in the reference period but had not exited by the end of it. The in-scope population therefore differs to straight counts of participation or commencement in Stream Services that may be shown in other Departmental publications and reports.

- Job placement outcomes Table 2.6 counts job seekers as in-scope if they
 were placed in a job that was recorded in DEEWR administrative systems
 during the reference period.
- <u>Activity placement outcomes</u> Table 2.7 counts job seekers as in-scope if they exited from an activity placement during the reference period.
- Work for the Dole outcomes Table 2.8 counts job seekers as in-scope if they exited from a Work for the Dole placement during the reference period.
- <u>Training in Job Search Techniques outcomes</u> Table 2.9 counts job seekers as in-scope if they exited a Training in Job Search Techniques placement during the reference period.
