We know it can be quite tricky to figure out exactly what this wage increase means for you. So we have devised this easy guide to make sure you know exactly what you could get.

We've broken it down into hourly, weekly and yearly rates for each classification.
Check out the table to see how this funding makes a difference to your wages and how much extra you could be earning.

MICHELLE MARTIN IS A CERT.III EDUCATOR AT GOODSTART BORONIA HEIGHTS:

She will now earn an extra \$3 an hour which means a weekly wage increase of \$114 - that's almost \$6000 a year.

"This will make a huge difference to my life and to the lives of my children. It means I don't have to worry about where money is coming from every week and how I am going to pay my bills from week to week. I did consider leaving the industry because of the low wages but I really didn't want to as I love my job. Now I don't have to think about leaving anymore."

KIM COOK IS THE DIRECTOR OF SWALLOW STREET CHILDCARE

She will now earn an extra \$5.06 per hour, \$192.38 a week, or more than \$10,000 a year.

"This wage increase makes me feel more valued and gives me security. I'm not getting any younger so I need to think about my retirement. For my staff it will make a huge difference, especially those that have children, who are really struggling."





DELIVERING PROFESSIONAL WAGES OVER TWO YEARS




How we did it

They could no longer remain silent while some of the most highly qualified and passionate ECEC educators were told that their qualifications meant nothing. They could no longer stand back while their colleagues left the industry in search of higher wages.

HUNE Julia Gillard calls crisis meeting

On 7th June 2012, Julia Gillard met with unions and childcare providers to discuss the problems facing the sector. With 180 highly-skilled educators leaving the industry each week because of low wages and those that stayed forced to take second and third jobs in order to make ends meet, she acknowledged that the sector was in crisis. Furthermore the Prime Minister committed to solving the problems facing the industry.



Big Steps launches TV ad


The Big Steps message hit TV screens on 2nd of July. The TV ad depicted the current crisis in childcare and how the mass exodus of workers impacted on the continuity of care and early learning experiences of children. It opened the eyes of many parents and they rowed in behind the campaign in huge numbers. Directors, educators, parents, and children gathered at Amaroo Early Childhood Centre in Townsville for the first official launch of the ad. It was a huge success with a family fun brunch, plenty of activities for kids and the debut screening of the ad. The next stop was Cairns, followed by Mackay, Rockhampton, the Gold Coast, and Brisbane. The launches were hugely successful. Not only were they a great day out for those who attended, they also generated a lot of positive media interest.





Educator's Day & Big Steps celebration days

Wednesday 5th September was officially declared Educator's Day. This was the next step in our campaign — to raise awareness in the community of the crisis facing the sector. In the following weeks, we held Big Steps celebration days in centres across the state as our way of saying thank you to our educators. It was also a great opportunity for parents across the state to personally thank the educators for the valuable contribution they make to their children's lives every day. Radio station BIO5 also came on board with the campaign and the BIO5 Black Thunders helped us celebrate the valuable contribution of educators.






Presenting the petition to the Treasurer

We launched an online petition in June calling on the Federal Government to support our educators with funding for wages in the sector. The response was overwhelming. In just a few weeks, over 7.000 people had signed the petition — including Julia Gillard herself! By September we had received over 12,000 signatures and presented the petition to Treasurer Wayne Swan at the ALP convention in Brisbane. Over one hundred educators, parents, and children flooded the foyer of the Mercure Hotel to show Mr Swan that we meant business, with the children handing over 48 giant crayons — each one representing 230 of the people who signed our petition. The event was a huge success and received national coverage on ABC news!


Now 16 National Big Steps Day

The next big step in the campaign was the National Day of Action on the 17th of November. In the biggest show of support for early childhood education and care in Australia's history, over 10,000 educators, parents, and children took part in events across the nation. Brisbane residents saw a sea of red as over 800 supporters marched from Kurilpa Park to Reddaciiff Place, where Bananas in Pyjamas put on a free concert for the kids. The campaign received national media coverage that day and the demand for higher wages in the sector grew.



Taking the Big Steps message to the streets in Lilley

We knew drastic action needed to be taken and we were also aware that Treasurer Wayne Swan was the main obstacle to our funding proposal. In order to convince Mr Swan to allocate the much needed funding for wages in the sector, we took the campaign directly to his electorate in Lilley, and we didn't let up. From December through to February 2013, we spread the Big Steps message through door knocking, road-side campaigning, and information stalls in shopping centres in the area. We asked residents to put a sticker on their wheelie bin that read, "I support Big Steps. Why don't you, Mr Swan?" Educators in the area sacrificed their lunch break every day to campaign outside his office. But it was worth it. The incredible strength, determination, and passion of our educators proved to the Federal Government that we were not going to back down, and high-level talks took place.

Together we have won professional recognition for our Early Childhood Education and Care educators with the government announcing more than \$300 million for wage increases in the sector.

The effects of what you have achieved today will be felt right across the nation for many years to come and without your hard work and dedication to the Big Steps campaign; this would not have been possible. •
