Departmental Rebranding

Has the department/Agency undergone a name change or any other form of rebranding since Additional Estimates in February, 2014? Answer

As the result of Machinery of Government changes on 18 September 2013 the Department of Education was created.

As at 31 May 2014, no costs have been incurred in relation to rebranding stationery (templates are made available online through the department's intranet and letters are only printed as needed), logos, consultancy, IT changes or office configuration.

From 24 February 2014 to 31 May 2014, new business cards were printed at a cost of \$2,306.37 (ex GST). New name badges have been printed at a cost of \$902.55 (ex GST).

There have been no costs incurred for office signage for the Department of Education. Costs of \$5300 (ex GST) have been incurred for office signage for the Shared Services Centre.
