# Non-metropolitan applicants

#### Question

Can you confirm that offers to non-metropolitan applicants fell more sharply than those to metropolitan applicants?

Were non-metropolitan applicants more likely overall to receive an offer than their city cousins? Does this indicate the key role played by regional providers?

#### **Answer**

- 1. Offers to metropolitan and non-metropolitan applicants changed in line with the stable trend in applications over recent years.
- 2. Applications from non-metropolitan applicants were more likely to result in an offer compared with applications from metropolitan applicants, 86.5 per cent compared with 83.6 per cent respectively.
- 3. Regional providers play an important role.
