Question

Referring to the agreements between the Commonwealth and the states on kindergarten and preschool funding for 2015.

- 1. What are the differences in the terms of each bilateral implementation agreement between jurisdictions?
- 2. What are the current targets and how is each jurisdiction progressing against each of the targets?
- 3. Does the Department anticipate any jurisdictions not meeting the targets set? What penalties would be imposed as a result?

Answer

State and territory implementation plans set out strategies for providing universal access and delivering on the outcomes and outputs set out in the National Partnership Agreement on Universal Access to Early Childhood Education. The plans reflect the different contexts in which preschool programmes are delivered in each jurisdiction.
