VET FEE-HELP

Question

1. How many students have contacted the Department to request information on how to have a VET FEE-HELP loan waived due to problems with an RTO?

2. What advice are students given when making inquiries about having a VET FEE-HELP loan waived?

3. What advice does the Study Assist hotline provide when questioned about having a VET FEE-HELP loan walved?

4. How many VET FEE-HELP loans have been waived?

5. How many VET FEE-HELP loans have been waived due to quality concerns?

Answer

- 1. The department does not keep specific records of enquiries which may lead to a waiver. The department ensures that a student is given all the information they may need which may include grievance procedures and waiver procedures.
- 2. Under the current arrangements established in 2008, there are limited circumstances for students to seek to have their debt revoked. Under these processes, students are required to first seek a remittance of debt through their provider. If students have exhausted all formal avenues with their provider for remittance of their VET FEE-HELP debt, they are advised they can seek a waiver through the Department of Finance. The Department of Education and Training provides the student with information on how to apply through the Department of Finance for a waiver of their VET FEE-HELP debt.

Students will also be informed of new processes that will be introduced from 1 January 2016, subject to the passage of legislation, to streamline debt remission and revocation processes for students under VET FEE-HELP.

- 3. Students are advised to send their enquiry to <u>tsenquiries@education.gov.au</u> to request assistance if the Study Assist hotline agent cannot answer their question. The department then provides advice as per question 2.
- 4. Waivers are administered by the Department of Finance. The Department of Finance has advised that no VET FEE-HELP debts were waived between 1 January 2008 and 22 June 2015. However, the department is aware of a number that have been waived by providers.
