# Compulsory Maths and Science exemptions

#### Question

Referring to the Minister for Education's transcript from May 29 after the Education Council Meeting, in which he said:

- "There would always be exceptions for those students who aren't interested or capable of doing science or maths for whatever reason."
- 1. How would the exceptions work?
- 2. The Minister says that those students who aren't "interested" would be exempt from studying science or maths. Isn't this the case currently?
- 3. If students are exempt from studying science or maths dues to not being interested, doesn't this mean that these subjects would not be compulsory at all?

#### **Answer**

Approaches to exemptions would be a matter for states and territories to determine.

Some jurisdictions require students to study a science subject or mathematics in senior secondary years.
