Question

Senator CAMERON: Do you have any idea how many students will have to change provider in the middle of a course because of the changes?

Mr Morling: I might be able to find that, but it is perhaps best if I take it on notice. By way of clarification, some providers in both programs that are exiting will not exit on 30 June; they will be allowed to teach out their students. In the SEE program they will be able to teach out to a block of 200 hours of training. So not all providers will exit the program at the end of June.

Senator CAMERON: If you could provide the detail.

Mr Morling: Sure.

Answer

Across Australia the number of students who are expected to change provider are:

- AMEP – 10,193 students
- SEE Program - 3612 students

The figures are based on clients in training on 19 June 2017.
