Question

Senator O'NEILL: But they are saying it is unsustainable and you are saying, no, everything is fine. You are saying it is sustainable and the people on the ground doing the job, managing it, making sure that students in regional communities have access, who have just got their hopes up because of demand driven system opening possibilities—the systems are saying they are under threat.

Senator Birmingham: I think we have already taken on notice somewhere tonight providing some university-by-university income data. If we have not, we will now. I look forward to you seeing just by how much each of the institutions has seen their revenue increase under the demand driven system.

Answer

The following table shows the total revenue reported by each university for the 2010 and 2015 financial reporting periods, as well as the increase in revenue across this period in both dollar and percentage terms. These amounts show revenue from higher education operations only, and therefore exclude VET operations. 2010 amounts have been adjusted for inflation and are shown in 2015 equivalent dollars.
