School Funding Estimator

The Australian Government has announced new fairer, needs-based school funding arrangements that will see record investment in schools.

By 2027, all schools will be funded on the same basis by the Commonwealth. In line with our role as majority funder of non-government schools, we will provide a consistent share of 80 per cent of a non-government school's Schooling Resource Standard (SRS), which is a measure of a school's need including a base amount per student and loadings for disadvantage. For government schools, the Australian Government will contribute 20 per cent of the school's SRS. This is in line with state and territory governments' role as the majority funders of government schools.

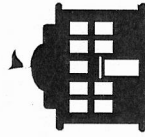

- This estimate is based on latest enrolment data reported to the Commonwealth Department of Education and Training and assumes the same student population applies from 2017 to 2027 to allow meaningful comparison. If the number of enrolled students in your school changes, this will be reflected in the final Commonwealth payment for your school for each year.
- All figures are an estimate only and numbers may not add due to rounding.
- All 2017 figures are based on anticipated 2017 payments to approved authorities under the Australian Education Act 2013. For schools within approved authorities for more than one school, 2017 funding has been nominally allocated to your school to reflect the proportion of your authority's Schooling Resource Standard funded by the Commonwealth in 2017. This enables meaningful comparisons between your school's 2017 and 2018 Commonwealth funding.
- Final arrangements are subject to the passage of legislation.
- Government schools receive the majority of their funding from their state or territory government, reflecting historic and constitutional responsibilities. Non-government schools receive funding from a variety of sources including private income through fees and government funding from their state or territory.
