Question

Cost benefit analysis of Government health and safety regulations

Has government health & safety protection regulation been subject to cost-benefit-analysis (CBA) including the many under-stated costs such as those from unintended consequences, bureaucracy and the 'baptists & bootleggers' phenomenon?

Answer

Yes, work health and safety regulations have been subject to cost-benefit analysis.

Regulation Impact Statements (RIS) are required to be undertaken for all Cabinet submissions or any non-Cabinet decision made by any Australian Government entity if that decision is likely to have a measurable impact on businesses, community organisations, individuals or any combination of them. A similar requirement exists for state and territory government entities.

For example, a RIS was prepared for the implementation of Australia's harmonised work health and safety (WHS) regulations and codes of practice in 2011.
