Senator Ruston asked on 14 November 2014, Hansard page 65

Question

Sub bachelor courses

Senator RUSTON: Do we have any stats on the lower-SES students who are likely to be seeking this sort of pathway into university? Ms Borthwick: I do not think we have them here today, but we can see if we can find them. ... Senator RUSTON: Are we seeing any difference in the graduation rate? CHAIR: It is a very socially progressive policy. Senator RUSTON: Yes—so, from the different methods of accessing education and pathways? Ms Borthwick: Again, we might have to take that on notice, but my memory is that there is a much higher success rate for students who have been through preparatory or pathway courses.

Answer

Refer to Table 1

A high proportion of low-SES students undertake sub-bachelor courses (22%) and enabling courses (29.3%) as pathways into university.

Domestic students commencing a bachelor course in 2005, who had completed a prior enabling course, had a higher completion rate eight years after commencement (62.6%), compared to school leavers with an ATAR under 60 (55.1% completion rate) and only a slightly lower completion rate compared to school leavers with an ATAR between 60 and 69 (63.7% completion rate).

Nationally, 72.3% of the 2005 cohort of domestic bachelor students commencing at Table A universities had completed a course within eight years of commencement.
