### Question

### Restart - number of job seekers benefitted

The Government has claimed this subsidy will benefit 32,000 job seekers annually -How many job seekers has the subsidy benefitted to date? - Can the Committee be provided with a breakdown of these by state, by age, and by Stream? - How many employers does the Government expect to be paying out the subsidy to in this financial year?

### Answer

The Restart programme is demand driven.

As at 25 November 2014, 510 Restart job placements have been approved (334 Job Services Australia participants; 176 Disability Employment Services participants).

As the programme is demand driven, it is difficult to predict the level of take up. The level of take up is likely to increase in the first 12 months as employers become aware of the programme.
