# Explanatory notes

Job seekers are allocated into one of the four Streams based on their level of disadvantage in the labour market as assessed through the Job Seeker Classification Instrument and / or Employment Services Assessment.

These Streams are as follows:

- **Stream 1** the most job ready job seekers
- **Stream 2** job seekers with <u>moderate</u> barriers to employment
- **Stream 3** job seekers with <u>significant</u> barriers to employment
- **Stream 4** job seekers with <u>severe</u> vocational and non-vocational barriers to employment.

Some job seekers will be assessed as **Partially Eligible** if they are entitled to work in Australia, are not working more than 15 hours per week, and not studying full-time. This may include:

- job seekers who are not eligible for Income Support due to their own or partner's income
- recipients of payments such as the Age Pension, Sickness Allowance, Disability Pension (Department of Veteran Affairs) and so on
- job seekers on Income Support waiting or exclusion periods including migrants serving the two year Newly Arrived Residents Waiting Period
- certain visa holders with working rights (but not those on working holidays).

These job seekers will be eligible to access **Stream 1 (Limited)** assistance that provides access to assistance with preparing a résumé, advice on the local labour market and access to job search computers in provider or Department of Human Services' offices.

A small number of job seekers, for example those awaiting the completion of their Employment Services Assessment or those without an active Job Seeker Classification Instrument, will be in an **Eligibility to be Determined** Stream. This is generally a holding Stream until the appropriate Stream for the job seeker is finalised.
