committee.

Answer

Comcare engaged with the Australian Council of Trade Unions (ACTU) and the Law Council of Australia via written letter and email on 10 September 2015. Comcare also convened a meeting with the Australian Law Council on 20 October 2015 to discuss Comcare's role and responsibilities in the SRC Act changes process and established stronger communication protocols between Comcare and the Law Council of Australia.

A teleconference with the ACTU occurred on 6 November 2015 to discuss how best to engage with the Union regarding the proposed SRC Act changes. The consultation is ongoing.

Comcare engaged with the ACTU and the Law Council of Australia as they represent the key industry groups for consultation. Comcare relies on these peak bodies to further disseminate consultation information to their members.
