Reconnection penalties

- a) How many Reconnection penalties were applied in 2014-15? How many were imposed on job seekers with a Centrelink 'vulnerability indicator'?
- b) For each time period please list by type of vulnerability indicator, and provide a breakdown by Indigenous and non-Indigenous job seekers.

Answer

There were 99,165 reconnection failures applied between 1 July 2014 and 30 June 2015, of which 17,677 were applied to job seekers with a Vulnerability Indicator.
