## Federal funding for students

#### Question

If averaged out, how much federal funding did each publicly educated student receive in the 2015/16 financial year?

If averaged out, how much federal funding did each privately educated student receive in the 2015/16 financial year?

If averaged out, how much federal funding did each privately and publicly educated student receive in the 2015/16 financial year, broken down state by state?

If averaged out, how much federal funding is each publicly educated student expected to receive in the 2016/17 financial year?

If averaged out, how much federal funding is each privately educated student expected to receive in the 2016/17 financial year?

#### **Answer**

1. The Australian Government is the minority public funder of government schools. In 2015–16 average per-student funding provided by Commonwealth and state and territory governments, with respect to students attending government schools is as follows:

2. The Australian Government is the majority public funder of non-government schools. In 2015–16 average per-student funding provided by Commonwealth and state and territory governments with respect of students attending non-government schools is as follows:

  - a. The FTE for students at both government and non-government schools is calculated using projections based on the latest available actual data as at 2016–17 Budget (latest published estimates).
  - b. 2016–17 Commonwealth Recurrent Funding is based on recurrent funding estimates as at 2016–17 Budget (latest published estimates)
- 3. State and total public funding figures are based on the assumption that all states and territories fund schools as if they were fully participating consistent with the *Australian Education Act 2013*. The Commonwealth cannot guarantee that states and territories will provide funding based on the current model.

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
