Adult Migrant English Program

Question

Ms Lynch-Magor: Social English is part of the new Adult Migrant English Program's business model that is currently being tendered for. It is a new service offering, where we are able to offer a stream of English language education which focuses on social English for clients who may not be seeking to enter the workforce.
