Are you able to provide me with the most recent tourist arrival figures for Tasmania?</p> <p>Mr O'Sullivan: To December 2015, Tasmania had a spend of \$351 million in visitor expenditure by international visitors. That was a 34 per cent increase, year on year, on spend in that particular state, and that was generated by 212,000 international visitors, which was an increase by about 20 per cent from the previous year.</p> <p>Senator CAROL BROWN: How many of those arrivals were into the Hobart airport?</p> <p>Mr O'Sullivan: Senator, I will have to take that on notice and come back to you on that one.
