Did the Social Inclusion Unit provide advice or make suggestions to any sector of the Federal or Queensland Governments when they became aware that not-for-profits were not covered by the initial Old NDRRA activation? Please provide details of the tenor of the advice/suggestions provided? Social Inclusion is focussed on providing policy solutions for vulnerable and marginalised people. **Answer:** 

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(a) Could you please supply the date of the first letter from the Queensland Premier Anna Bligh to the Prime Minister asking for disaster recovery assistance for the Queensland community and 'not-for-profit' groups adversely affected by flood or cyclone?

On 31 December 2010, the Queensland Premier, the Hon Anna Bligh MP, wrote to the Prime Minister requesting the provision of recovery grants for small businesses and primary producers impacted by the Queensland floods.

On 27 January 2011, the Queensland Premier wrote to the Prime Minister requesting the provision of concessional loans and recovery grants for not-for-profit organisations and charitable businesses impacted by the Queensland floods.

(a)(i) Can you confirm whether this letter had to be sent back to be reformulated by the Queensland Premier?

Neither letter was returned to the Queensland Premier to be reformulated.

(a)(ii) If so, what was wrong with that letter?

(a)(iii) How did the second reformulated letter differ from the first one sent by the Queensland Premier?
