Senator PAYNE - ... How does COAG allow the review of a national partnership implementation plan to be delayed until six weeks after the end of the reporting period, which means the council does not have an adequate opportunity to review the plans properly and in a timely way?

Answer:

The COAG Reform Council's report on progress on the Seamless National Economy reforms released in February 2010 flagged concerns with the clarity of the competition reform stream implementation plan. The Business Regulation and Competition Working Group (BRCWG) subsequently considered several papers recommending revisions to the competition reform stream implementation plan. The BRCWG agreed to a final set of revisions to the plan on 21 June 2010.
